My Weather Journey



In May '51 I reported for the draft and next day joined the Navy. First to book camp at Great Lakes, then to NAS Jax. for AnP school, next to Lakehurst for weather training and finally to NAS Brunswick Me, for duty.

In Feb. orders came to report to Opalocka FL for training in a research project, Tracking of Hurricanes using a Seismograph. Reported to NAS Jacksonville for duty.

After 2 yrs I reported to the USS Worcester for a shakedown cruise to GITMO., I was discharged in May, 55. Next I graduated in '59 from H.V.C.C. Troy NY with an AAS degree as an Industrial Lab Tech.

Completed 30 yrs at GE plastics in Pittsfield MA. Hold a US patient in plastic processing. In Jan. 1999 I found that 3 of 8 prostate samples were cancerous and had 25 modified x-ray treatments and 103 radioactive seeds implanted. It was successful, I have my large weather map displayed on the USS Hornet, I've given one to Ch 10 in Albany NY, to TV 6, in Orlando FI, and have a large weather display in the Taveras Historical Museum FI with a pictorial history of the US Navy Microseismic Program.



I was interviewed by TV 6 for their story on Surviving the storm in 2016. I've self-published a book, SO WHAT IF THE GOD OF THE BIBLE EXISTS. My wife's previous husband was a World-famous Greek wrestler. She also published his life story called, BOOTS FULL OF MEMORIES.
