Capt. Colin Armstrong succumbs at 93

Capt. Colin Armstrong, who served as a U.S. Navy aviator during World War II, and went on to become a county commissioner and community leader, died Wednesday, Nov. 15, in McMinnville. He was 93.

Funeral services have been scheduled for 1 p.m. Monday, Nov. 27, in the chapel at Macy & Son Funeral Directors.

Armstrong was named McMinnville's Man of the Year for 2005 at the Jaycees' annual Distinguished Service Awards banquet.

"I love McMinnville," he said when he accepted the surprise award. "There are many great leaders here, and their success always depends on teamwork."

Armstrong grew up in McMinnville. In fact, he piloted his first plane here — a pedal-powered model enabling him to careen along sidewalks near his home.

He started first grade in the inaugural class at Cook Elementary School, recently renovated to house district administrative offices. He went on to graduate in 1941 from Lincoln High School, forerunner of McMinnville High School.

After a few months riveting B-17 bombers for Boeing, he started college at Oregon State University. He wanted to earn the four-year degree then required of Navy pilots.

During summers, he helped build the giant blimp hangars at Tillamook.

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In 1943, when the Navy dropped its degree requirement in a move to boost the ranks, he quit college to sign up. He learned to fly fighter planes and land them on aircraft carriers.

When the war ended, Armstrong remained in the service. He was tasked with ferrying planes to repair shops or other destinations.

He enjoyed telling the story of one trip, when he lifted off from a base in the Bay Area in a Grumman F4F Wildcat, an older model of the F6F Hellcat he usually flew.

He said he looked down to concentrate on the older version of wheel retraction system. When he raised his head, the Oakland Bay Bridge was right in front of him.

"I had to fly under," he said.

He returned home to finish college at Linfield. He also joined the Naval Reserve and remained active until 1972.

Following his final duty assignment in Washington, D.C., Armstrong returned to his hometown for good.

An architect by trade, he was elected to four-year terms on the county's board of commissioners in 1974 and 1978. He later served on the McMinnville Airport Commission for many years.

He was known for his collection of vintage Lincoln Continental convertibles.

His cars were often seen in parades, the annual Dragging the Gut Festival, the Amity Pancake Breakfast and the Lions Annual Drive-in, Fly-in Breakfast. They've also carried many Mac High homecoming courts.

Armstrong was active in the McMinnville Presbyterian Church, which he served as a deacon, and in the McMinnville Rotary Club. He and his wife, Millie, spearheaded the Yamhill County Historical Society's huge annual garage sale, among other activities.

He also served as a docent at the Evergreen Aviation & Space Museum as a volunteer representative on its governing board. He served on the committee that chooses inductees for the Oregon Aviation Hall of Honor, and was inducted himself.

Colin L. Armstrong 1923 - 2017

Colin Linville Armstrong passed away November 15, 2017, in his hometown of McMinnville, Oregon. Born in Portland and losing his father very early in life, he was raised on Galloway Street in McMinnville with his older brother, Charles Willard, by his mother, Laura Millicent Armstrong, (a 39-year employee of McMinnville Water & Light) and his grandmother, Carrie Linville Sherwood (Yamhill County Deputy Sheriff and Tax Collector).

The family were staunch members of the First Presbyterian Church, and Colin was enrolled in 1st grade with the inaugural class of Cook Elementary School. He graduated from McMinnville High School, then known as Lincoln High School, and attended Oregon State University before leaving in 1943 to join the U.S. Navy and earn the gold wings of a Naval Aviator, a lifelong ambition.

Discharged after World War II, he returned to McMinnville, graduated from Linfield College, and began a career as an architect. Recalled to active duty as a pilot during the Korean War, he remained in the U.S. Navy through Vietnam, and retired after 29 years at the rank of Captain.

In his retirement, Colin returned to his hometown and was elected Yamhill County commissioner; and re-elected for a second term unopposed. Always an active member of many civic groups and governmental commissions, he was a deacon of First Presbyterian Church, awarded Man of the Year by the Junior Chamber of Commerce, and was inducted into the Oregon Aviation Hall of Honor. As a hobby, the collection and restoration of Lincoln Continental convertibles consumed his spare time. Eventually, Colin had his own parade of Lincolns, 1961, '62, '63, '64, '65, '66 and '67; one for every model-year built.

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Colin is survived by his wife of 70 years, Milly Lou (Squires); three children, Laura Gay Welliver (Larry), Daniel Squires Armstrong (Patty) and Vernon Douglas Armstrong; as well as four grandchildren and four great-grandsons.

Funeral services will be held at 1:00 p.m. Monday, November 27, 2017, at the Chapel of Macy & Son, with viewing from noon to 12:30 p.m. the same day. Interment will be at Evergreen Memorial Park. To leave online condolences, please visit www.macyandson.com

Norman Latham Canfield of Woodbury, MN, previously of Asheville died in April 2022, at age 100, surrounded by family. Norm will be interred in Arlington National Cemetery next to his wife, Virginia. His education included University of New Hampshire, B.S. Mathematics; MIT graduate programs; University of Michigan, M.S. Meteorology. Three months after Pearl Harbor, he was commissioned as a Naval Reserve Officer and served as the Aerology (weather) Officer-in-Charge and/or Forecaster in the United States, Bermuda, and Plymouth, England (alongside RAF Coastal Command). His work in Bermuda and England supported WW2 FAW7 antisubmarine patrols.

After the Navy, Norman worked for the Weather Bureau/National Weather Service (NWS) and held positions in MA, NH, NY, NC, and MD. His position titles over the decades included Aviation Forecaster; Chief, Marine Section; Chief, Climatic Analysis; Regional Climatologist, NWS Eastern

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Region (supervising 11 state climatologists serving 16 states); Chief, Data Acquisition Division, then at NOAA headquarters; Physical Scientist/senior staff climatologist, Director NOAA Climate Office. He was the managing editor and principal author of the first edition of the seven volume U.S. Marine Climate Atlas of the World; a compilation of tens of millions of weather records from Dutch, German, English, and U.S. ships. He received numerous Navy and Weather Bureau commendations and awards including, for example, US Department of Commerce Bronze Medal in 1966.

He retired from NOAA in 1982 and began working and volunteering as a Research Associate for the University of Maryland collaborated with Helmut Landsburg until full retiring in 2017. He published a variety of scientific, aviation, military articles; the latest published in 2016.

His memberships included American Association for the Advancement of Science, American Association of State Climatologists, American Meteorological Society (former Chairman, Asheville, NC and New York City Chapters), Air and Waste Management Association, National Weather Association, Naval Weather Service Association, New York Academy of Sciences (He was a Fellow, Chairman of the Atmospheric Sciences and Planetary Sciences sections, and N-35 Climatology Technical Committee). 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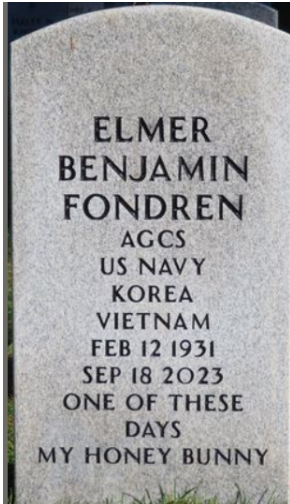

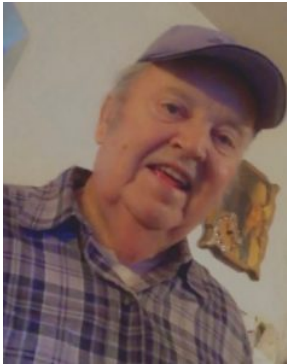
