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Richard D Gilmore, Cmdr. USN (Ret)
August 8, 1933 - July 19, 2024

Richard D. Gilmore, 90, known to most of his friends as Dick, died on the early morning of 19 July 2024 at Creekside Continuing Care Center in Burlington, Washington after a long illness.

He was born in Beatrice, Nebraska on August 8, 1933 and graduated from Beatrice High School in 1951. He married the former Barbara Jean Eiben in Beatrice on June 20, 1954. After joining the Navy in 1952, he quickly progressed through the enlisted ranks, attaining the rank of Chief Petty Officer in 1959. He was commissioned as a Limited Duty Officer in 1962 and retired in 1980 with the rank of Commander. He served at many duty stations during his naval service but felt that his most significant and challenging assignment was as the on-scene meteorologist and oceanographer for the CIA's 1974 successful raising of a sunken Soviet Golf II class submarine from the ocean bottom in over 16,000 feet of water in the middle of the North Pacific Ocean (also known as the Azorian Project). His service as a flight meteorologist in VW-1, a typhoon tracking squadron on Guam in 1968-1970, was his favorite duty assignment. During his time with VW-1, he participated in the successful flight penetrations of over 70 tropical cyclones, including several typhoons with sustained winds in excess of 100 knots.

Cmdr. Gilmore moved to Oak Harbor, WA with his family in 1975, where he was assigned as the Officer-in-Charge of the Naval Weather Service Environmental Detachment at NAS Whidbey Island. He transferred to Fleet Weather Central, Guam in 1978 as Operations Officer and, subsequently, Executive Officer. After his retirement from the Navy in 1980, he returned to Oak Harbor and spent several years as a self-employed, consulting meteorologist. He was also employed as a marine meteorologist for Global Weather Dynamics, Inc. of Monterey, California, teaching marine meteorology to Saudi Arabian students before traveling to Abidjan, Ivory Coast in West Africa to act as the on-scene meteorologist and oceanographer for the delicate placement of a jack-up oil rig in Ivory Coast's coastal waters. Most recently, he was employed as a meteorologist for Science Applications International Corporation, (SAIC) also of Monterey, California, retiring from SAIC on March 30, 2001. He and his wife Barbara moved to Anacortes in February 2003.

He was an active volunteer in the Oak Harbor community, serving on the Board of Management for the Armed Services YMCA for several years in the 1980's, and Island County United Way in the early 1990's. He served as Campaign Chairman for the Island County United Way fund drive in 1990, followed by a year as President of the United Way Board of Directors in 1991. He served as Campaign Chairman for Representative Barry Sehlin in his successful bid to win a seat in the Washington State Legislature in 1992 and assisted Representative Sehlin in three subsequent campaigns. Cmdr. Gilmore was a member of The Military Officers Association of America, Navy Mutual Aid Association, and was a life member of the Naval Weather Service Association.

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Cmdr. Gilmore is survived by Barbara, his cherished wife of over 70 years, sons Colonel Mark Gilmore, United States Army (Retired) and wife JoAnn York-Gilmore of Anacortes, WA, and Steven Gilmore of Stanwood, WA; two grandsons, Ryan and Christopher Gilmore; three granddaughters, Samantha Fujiwara of Albany, OR, Kristan Branson of Leavenworth, KS, and Sonja Johnson of Norfolk, VA; seven great-grandchildren; and one great-great grandchild. In addition, he is survived by several nieces and nephews. His parents Lloyd and Julia Mae Gilmore, brothers Lloyd and James Gilmore, sister Jacquelyn Howard and beloved granddaughter Charlotte (Gilmore) Boches preceded him in death.

Knoll, Denys W., Rear Adm., USN (Ret.) (1907–1989)

Admiral Knoll's strength was as a staff officer. The list of individuals on whose staffs he served: Admiral Thomas C. Hart, Admiral Ernest J. King, Ambassador Averell Harriman, Admiral Richmond Kelly Turner, Rear Admiral Walter F. Boone, Vice Admiral Arthur D. Struble, Admiral Arleigh A. Burke, Vice Admiral Alfred M. Pride, Vice Admiral Stuart H. Ingersoll, Vice Admiral Wallace M. Beakley, Vice Admiral Glynn R. Donaho, and Admiral Robert L. Dennison.

Knoll graduated from the Naval Academy in 1930. He served 1930–32 in the battleship Texas (BB-35), sandwiched around unsuccessful flight training at Pensacola in 1931. In 1932–34 he served on board the destroyers Southard (DD-207) and Preble (DD-345). After participating in a Navy geographical survey of the Aleutian Islands in 1934, he served in the battleship Oklahoma (BB-37), 1934–36, then took a three-month course in chemical warfare at Edgewood Arsenal in 1936. He was a student at the Navy's Postgraduate School, 1936–38, then received a master's degree in aerology from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1939. In 1939–40 Knoll served with Patrol Wing Five. He had an extended period on the staff of Commander in Chief Asiatic Fleet, 1940–42, and was evacuated from Corregidor just before it fell to the Japanese in May 1942. He was stationed in Washington, 1942–44 on the CominCh staff, officer in charge of the weather central, and assistant secretary, Joint Chiefs of Staff. In 1944–45 was on the staff of the U.S. ambassador to the Soviet Union to facilitate

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implementation of Lend-Lease and agreements at the Tehran Conference. In 1946 Knoll was part of the U.S. military delegation to organizing meetings for the United Nations.

He commanded the oiler Severn (AO-61), 1946–47, before service in the strategic planning section of OpNav, 1948–52. He commanded the attack transport Menard (APA-201) in 1952 before returning to service in the strategic planning section of OpNav. In 1955 Knoll was commanding officer of the light cruiser Roanoke (CL-145) and from 1955 to 1957 was chief of staff to Commander Seventh Fleet. From 1957 to 1959 he served in the OpNav fleet maintenance division and as chairman of the Ship Characteristics Board. In 1959–60 he was Commander Destroyer Flotilla Four. In 1960–61 was director of the OpNav Technical Studies Group before duty in 1961–63 as Commander Service Force Atlantic Fleet, part of it during the Cuban Missile Crisis. From 1963 to 1965 Knoll was Oceanographer of the Navy, and his final active duty, from 1965 to 1967, was as Deputy Commander of the Military Sea Transportation Service. Post-retirement activities included employment by Litton Industries.

Historian Denys W. Knoll; retired admiral, diplomat

ERIE, Pa. (AP) —Retired U.S. Navy Rear Admiral Denys W. Knoll, 82, a World War II-era naval officer, ship commander, diplomat and author, has died. He was 82. Knoll, an Erie resident, died Wednesday at Saint Vincent Health Center after a brief illness. Before he turned to writing history, Knoll participated in some of 20th Century's key naval events. He was stationed in the Philippines when the Japanese bombed Pearl Harbor and subsequently invaded the U.S.-held Pacific islands. He also served as a commander on the naval staff there, working with the U.S. Navy code-breaking unit. He was one of the last American servicemen to leave the Philippines before Corregidor fell to the Japanese in May 1942. From 1942–44 he served on the staff of U.S. Chief of Naval Operations Adm. Ernest King. He was a member of the U.S. Military Mission to the Soviet Union in Moscow until 1945. Knoll also was involved in organizing the first military staff for the United Nations in 1945–46. The Knoll family had ties to the navy and Erie waterfront before Knoll achieved prominence in his naval career. His late mother, chosen to launch a new gunboat in 1936, cracked the traditional champagne bottle across the bow of the newly-christened USS Erie. After retiring in 1967 with the rank of rear admiral, Knoll became one of the leading authorities on the Battle of Lake Erie and the role of sea power in the War of 1812. He was the author of "Perry's Victory on Lake Erie." In the late 1980s he played a leading role in convincing Pennsylvania state government officials to appropriate the funds needed to restore the Flagship Niagara. Knoll was born in Erie on March 7, 1907, one of 14 children of the late Edmund Amandus and Ida Mary Illig Knoll. He graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1930.
