He worked as a research Physicist for the U.S. Navy in New London, CT, from 1957-1978 during which time he was resident technical manager of the Navy’s Bermuda Research Detachment, 1963-1967. In 1978 he transferred to the Navy’s research laboratory in Bay St. Louis, MS., from where he retired in 1986, during that period he and his family lived in Picayune, MS. On leaving the U.S. Navy, he received a five-year appointment to the NATO post of Deputy Director, SACLANT Underwater Research Center in La Spezia, Italy and later as a contract Liaison Scientist to the Office of Naval Research in London, England. On returning to the United States in 1991 he engaged in freelance consulting to the U.S. Navy. He was a member of the Picayune Rotary Club where he is a past president. He was married for 43 years to the former Geraldine Ahearn originally from Harford, CT, and now a resident of Diamondhead, MS. He has five surviving sons, Stephen of Boston, MA, Jeffrey of Florissant, MO, Jonathan of Fort Worth, TX, James of Seville, Spain, and Michael of London, England. He is also survived by six grandchildren, a brother, Donald Martin and a sister Elizabeth Aronson of Lebanon, CT. Robert McBeth

Robert B. “Mac” McBeth died suddenly on 11-12-13, a day after his 86th birthday, his beloved dog Mercy by his side. Born in Crescent City, CA on November 11, 1927, to Charlie and Addie McBeth, Bob was the second of six children: first came the four boys (Charles, Robert, Paul and Alan) and much later, two baby sisters (Rita and Carol). They were raised in northern California and southern Oregon. A veteran of WWII, the very young Bob saw the end of the war aboard a battleship in the Pacific. Following V-J Day in 1945, he left the Navy for a short stint as a crop duster in Oregon. After crash landing two planes, he reupped with the Navy for a 21-year career in meteorology. An historically significant moment of his naval career happened in 1962, while he was stationed on the island of

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Trinidad. Only 90 miles from Cuba, he and his company were on high alert and prepared to respond to the Soviet threat, the Cuban Missile Crisis. Bob retired from the Navy in 1966 and came to work for NCAR in Boulder as a weatherman. His impressive career in meteorology showed him the world: he traveled to both the Arctic and Antarctic, to Greenland, the South Pacific, Venezuela, and other sites around the globe; he was one of the first scientists allowed into China at the end of the Cultural Revolution and established a weather station in Tibet at over 18,000 feet. He was married to his wife, Lee, for over six decades, and shared this: "my wedding day was the very best day of my life." He and Lee raised three children: John McBeth (Lorraine), Davis, CA; Valerie McBeth (Kevin Allen), Boulder; and Jeff McBeth (Isabel), Longmont. He regularly busted buttons of pride over his six grandsons, three granddaughters, and one great-grandchild on the way. Bob was a nationally ranked skeet-shooter, played golf on U.S. Navy teams, and was an outstanding bowler. His other passions included biking - he set up a bike repair 'business' in his basement to repair all the flat tires for neighborhood children; he built birdhouses for birds in the neighborhood and for Habitat for Humanity fundraisers; he learned to make yoghurt at home, brewed pretty terrible beer and wine, and crafted amazing heirloom wood toys for his grandchildren in his wood shop. He had a rather short stint in the art of Bonsai and an incredibly long stint of impish wit, generosity, and joie de vivre. He loved all animals, in particular dogs, and was known as the 'dog whisperer' because of his very special connection with them. Bob kept current with technology and spent many hours in later years reading voraciously on his I-pad about everything from the solar system to modern music, as well as the latest spy novels. He is remembered both as a gentleman and a gentle man and he leaves behind a very proud family. A Christian celebration of life will be held on Monday, November 25th at 11 a.m. at First Presbyterian Church in Boulder.

He received his PhD at La Jolla, California. In 1997 he was diagnosed with Parkinson disease. By 2002 the disease was advancing very rapidly.
